The East Amwell Historical Society & Museum is open and available for tours the 2nd and 4th weekends of the month from 1-4 pm. The Museum is located in the Clawson House and is part of Clawson Park, both of which are East Amwell Township assets. The East Amwell Historical Society (EAHS) is entrusted with, and stewards of, the Ed Quick Collection which was purchased by the Township. after Mr. Quick's death.

The EAHS is a 501c3 non-profit charity and has worked with the County and Township to restore the house and decorate and furnish the museum with period furniture, ephemera and artifacts. Varied exhibit and artwork display space is available within the Museum which seeks to become more engaged with, and utilized by, the community and other local organizations like the Grange. The EAHS and Historic Preservation Committee (HPC) work together to publish an annual calendar that includes local boards, contacts and meeting information of which is available at the museum for pickup.

The EAHS and Clawson House is open to hosting (and co-hosting) local community events, programs and groups as practicable. Policies for its use are being developed and coordinated between the EAHS and HPC to assure and protect the Museum contents while facilitating access and appropriate use of this valuable museum and assets. The Clawson House Museum can accommodate small groups and programs with a video projector and screen as needed.
